

Mappleton Parish Council Minutes of the Meeting held on the 12th November 2019, in the Maple Garage Showroom. (By kind permission of Mr & Mrs G Burton)

Present: Cllr J. Burton, Cllr G. Burton, J.Froud(Clerk) Cllr K.Baish, Cllr S.Mars, Cllr C.Taylor, Ward Cllr J.Whittle, Ward Cllr B. Jefferson, 8 Members of the Public.

Apologies: Cllr S. Earle.

Minutes September 2019 minutes were agreed and signed as a true record.

Matters Arising: The drain outside of Maple Garage, Mappleton is still causing problems. Terry Weaver from ERYC has been out on Monday the 10th of November, it is believed that a recent installation may be causing the problem, Ward Councillor Barbara Jefferson will chase up.

Planning Matters: None.

Police Report: No one present. The Parish/Town News Release is attached to these minutes.

Willow Garth: No one present. Jim Froud reported that there has been a problem with the residents of Willowgarth using the Bus Shelter at Rolston, litter and human excrement have been found.

John Weldrick of Hatzfeld, Willowgarth has been informed, the problem seems to have arisen since the Bus has stopped picking residents up at the entrance to Willowgarth.

It was thought that the management at Willowgarth have a responsibility to transport residents into Hornsea and then pick them up when they need to return.

If the residents wish to use the Bus Stop at Rolston they should access it by using the right of way through Willowgarth to Rolston Village and then walk down the Lane.

John Weldrick has agreed to send his maintenance staff twice a week to check on the state of the Bus Shelter.

Ward Councillor Barbara Jefferson will write to John Weldrick to remind him of the agreements made when the initial planning was passed, for Willowgarth.

Accounts for Payment: Clerk's Fees £300.00, Maple Garage Fuel £20.00, IT Grant £350.00, IT Mappleton PC Contribution £250.00, Zurich Municipal Insurance £257.60. This was agreed.

Witherwick Community Wind Farm: Kim Baish handed out a written report, that is attached to these minutes.

Cllr Shawn Mars thought that the Bus Shelter at Cowden would not cost as much as the £500.00 grant that had been awarded from the Windfarm Fund. Cllr Kim Baish replied by saying that if all of the allotted money is not spent, then it will be repaid to the Windfarm Fund.

Anti-social Behavior at Cowden (Drugs): Reports of vehicles using the Lane at Cowden that runs up to the Cliff Top in the evening and late at night have been reported to the Police but no action is evident.

Drugs paraphernalia has been found dumped in a residents refuse bin.

Jim Froud to e-mail Ward Councillor Barbara Jefferson who will then forward to Inspector Cocker.

Cllr Shawn Mars is to telephone the Police Crime Commissioner, telling him of the problem.

Parishioners Questions:

Jim Froud reported that the Mappleton Parish Council website is now up and running, he asked for people wanting to post information on the site to contact him, details on the website.

AOB; A letter from Graham Stuart MP was read out asking for issues that needed raising with him. The only remark was about coastal erosion, Jim Froud to follow up.

Cllr Kim Baish reported that he thought that the siting of the Defibrillator at Mappleton would be better in the Old Telephone Box. The telephone box has already been adopted by Community Heartbeat, who have secured the electrical supply to the box.

Jim Froud is awaiting an introduction pack from the Charity, which is run by retired Ambulance Drivers.

Cllr Shawn Mars reported about wanting to apply for Planters on the roadside verges at the entrances to Cowden, residents have been identified by Shawn who will take on the maintenance and appearance of the Planters.

Jim Froud reported that he would need detailed drawings, and a summary of materials to be used, and exact locations of where the planters would be sited.

ERYC will make the decision to grant permission for the Planters.

Cllr Kim Baish reported that he had attended a meeting at Cowden Parva, about the future of the Bombing Range at Cowden.

It was previously thought that the site would be taken over by the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, the sticking point seems to be the buildings, which the MOD would like to be taken as well.

At the present time the Cowden Bombing Range is still on the market for sale.

Meeting closed at 8.25 pm.

Withernwick Community WindFarm.

Community Grants: grants to a total value of £500.

The following decisions and grants have been awarded.

A grant has been awarded to Mappleton for work to install a defibrillator £500.

We are currently investigating whether putting the defibrillator in the disused BT 'phone box would be preferable to putting it near the Tea Rooms.

A grant has been awarded to Cowden for £500 for putting a defibrillator on the wall of the Cross Keys PH. This has been done.

A grant of £350 has been awarded to Mappleton PC for the purchase of IT equipment.

Main Fund Grants: grants to a total of £20k per application

Aldbrough Methodist Church for the rewiring of the building total cost £3,520:00, grant awarded £1,500:00

Aldbrough Parish Council for the upgrade and replacement of dangerous play equipment total cost £38,246:00, grant awarded £20,000:00

ERYC Safer homes and improving home security, an ongoing project aimed at identifying vulnerable people and replacing old locks and making buildings safer. Total cost £3,000:00, grant awarded £2,000:00.

Hatfield Parish Council Village Green project, to upgrade and provide a better use of the green area at a total cost of £3,180:00, grant awarded £2,220:00.

Hornsea Youth Club for rent and salary for a Youth worker. Total cost £11,100:00 grant applied for £5,000:00. Award denied.

Other work and projects are ongoing which may or may not result in grants being awarded however I would say, as I always do, that I am keen that Mappleton, Cowden and Rolston are considered for grants when and if projects are brought forward. One such grant concerns refurbishment of the bus shelter at Cowden, I think this could be done for about £500:00 using volunteer labour.

A welcome reduction in all offences during the month of October is evident. Drug offences show a 57% increase on last year, to put this into perspective, figures in this area are low therefore an increase in four offences show a large spike in percentage. The majority of these offences have been highlighted as a result of proactive policing with the offenders receiving positive intervention in an attempt to educate and rehabilitate. Lead thefts from church roofs continue within the county, please be vigilant and report any suspicious activity within your community. Youth Family Support workers are on hand within Hornsea to assist police with tackling Anti-social behaviour. Figures should start to reflect the impact they are having on the town.

2. Crime Issues of particular note

There has been a run of scrap metal thefts around the Withernsea area. Items taken have included scrap piping, a metal phone box, a skip and a blacksmiths anvil.

There has also been a couple of thefts from vehicles in Welwick and Hedon with tools and a metal detector stolen.

This time of year also sees a rise in Hare coursing activities in rural areas, this is where people run their dogs in fields to catch hares and then bet on which dog will be successful. This activity is illegal, damage is caused to crops and fields and it is cruel to both the dogs and the unfortunate animal victim.
