

# Mappleton Parish Council Minutes of the Meeting held on the 8<sup>th</sup> of March 2022, in the Maple Garage Showroom (By kind permission of Graham & Janet Burton)

Minutes January 2022 minutes were agreed as a true record. Precept and Code of Conduct to amend.

Matters Arising: Terry Weaver has been to look at Hatfield Lane, Mappleton, Cllr Janet Burton reported that another part of the road is collapsing.

Cllr Kim Baish reported that the Church Clock has been repaired by a company sourced from Cumbria, they will have to come back as the striking mechanism has not been reinstated.

Police Report: No one present. The Police and Crime Plan 2021-2025 was made available to the Councillors.

Willow Garth: Nothing to report.

Accounts for Payment: Clerk's Fees £300.00, Postage £7.92. This was agreed.

Withernwick Community Wind Farm: The Withernwick Windfarm Grant of £1,000.00 has to be accounted for by the end of March 2022. It was decided that plants and bulbs will be bought with the money, a planting scheme will be drawn up and hopefully the work will be done by people on community service.

Proposal: Variation of Condition 27 (approved plans) to vary Turbine details (as added by 18/40153/NONMAT) of planning permission 08/01964/STPLFE

(APP/E2001/A/05/2088796) – Erection of 9 wind turbines, substation and construction of vehicular access and ancillary works.

Location: Energiekontor UK Limited Withernwick Windfarm, Cowden Lane, Withernwick, East Riding of Yorkshire HU11 4UH.

Applicant: Energiekontor UK Limited.

Application Type: Strategic -Variation of condition with EIA.

The Parish Council voted to object to this application on the grounds of increased noise.

Platinum Jubilee: A grant from ERYC is available for projects up to £500.00 to commemorate the Queens Platinum Jubilee, plans have to be submitted by the end of April 2022. It was thought that commemorative mugs for households in the Parish would be a good idea, Cllr Jim Warrington to make enquiries with Greys Farm, Mappleton who are believed to hand craft pottery.

Other ideas about a bench and planters were discussed, it was thought that something of use to mark the occasion would be the way to go. Jim Froud to contact the clerk at Hornsea to see who made some new benches in the Memorial Gardens in Hornsea.

Cllr Jim Warrington asked about any news on the Coastal path. Nothing has been heard, but some surveyors have been seen in various locations near to the cliff top.

Cllr Kim Baish reported some bad potholes on the Lane that runs next to Mill Hill Farm, Cowden, JF to report to ERYC.

I would like to make a couple of observations;

The large share of funds is going to Hornsea. Hardly surprising when we consider that Hornsea is our largest population centre.

- Not one penny has been granted to Mapleton, Cowden or Rolston! I find that disappointing but given our small population, lack of groups such as a YC/school and the 'spread out' nature of the 3 parishes maybe not that surprising.
- As a Council and as individuals we must get our 'thinking caps' on and try to get a scheme off the ground. I would like us to attend May's PC meeting with one idea each that we can work up into at least one application.
- Skirlaugh has begun to make more applications and I think this is because, like Hornsea, they have a well remunerated PC Clerk who is good at filling in applications.
